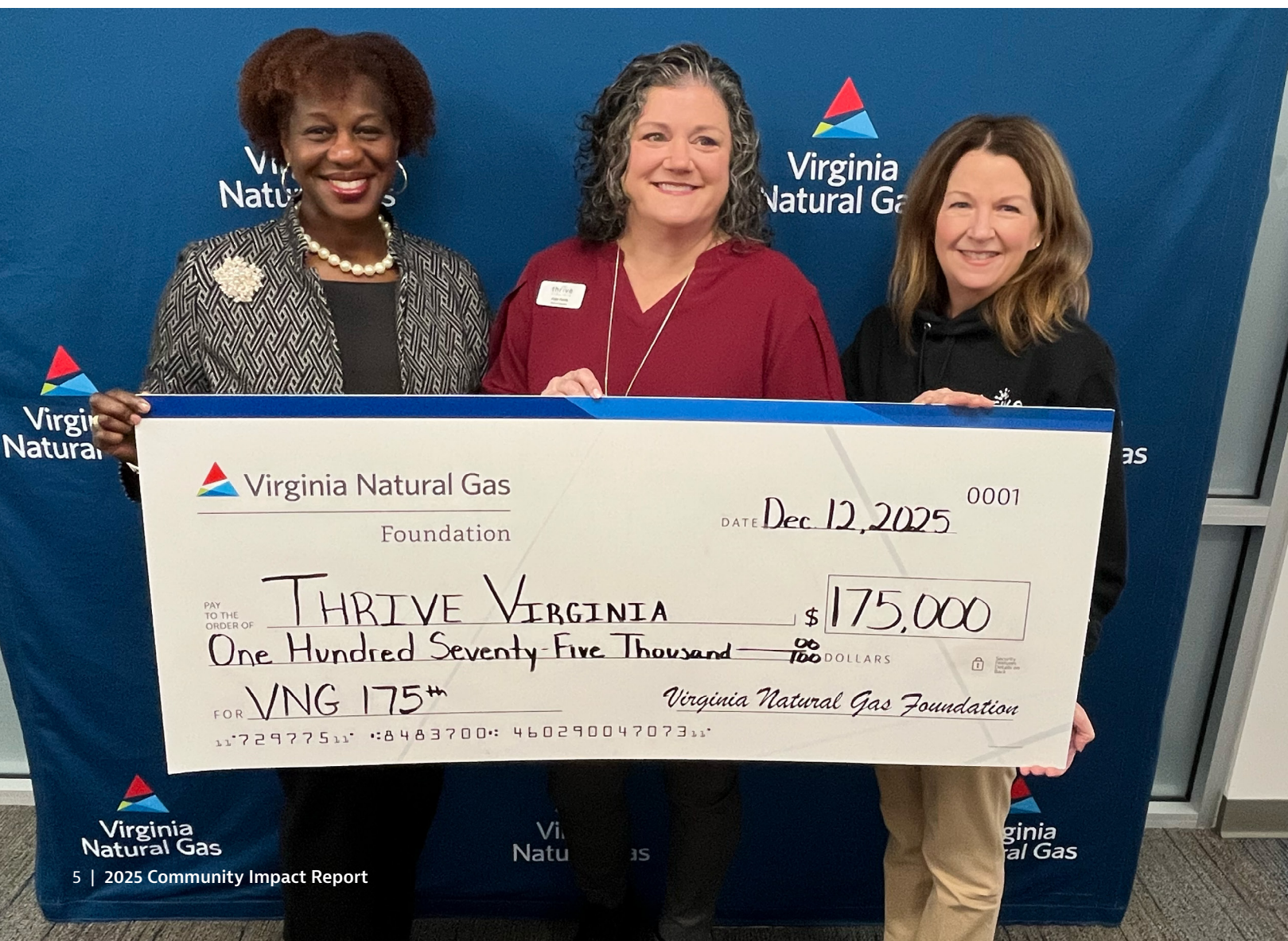

# Children & Education

## Fueling Creativity: How VNG Supports the Governor's School for the Arts

Founded in 1987, The Governor's School for the Arts (GSA) is a unique public high school in Hampton Roads that blends a nontraditional schedule with intensive training in the visual and performing arts. Serving more than 400 students daily, GSA has built a creative community that inspires artistic vision and lifelong passion.

In 2025, Virginia Natural Gas supported GSA's new consolidated Downtown Norfolk campus, which brings together six disciplines: Dance, Musical Theatre, Instrumental Music, Theatre and Film, Visual Arts and Vocal Music. Each program requires specialized spaces and equipment, and students also participate in public performances and exhibitions in both school and professional venues, allowing them to fully immerse themselves in their craft.

GSA emphasizes emerging technologies and real-world skills, giving students experience in creative production, collaboration, critical thinking and deadline-driven work. This preparation contributes to strong outcomes: the Class of 2025 earned nearly \$19 million in scholarships and advanced to colleges, training programs and technical careers.

With support from Virginia Natural Gas, GSA continues to invest in exceptional learning environments, regional arts partnerships and pathways that help students succeed in both arts and non-arts fields.





# Community Enrichment

## Volunteering to Fight Food Insecurity

At Virginia Natural Gas, employee volunteerism is a cornerstone of our commitment to building stronger communities. Each year, our team rallies together for the annual Energy to Give campaign, partnering with local charities and nonprofits to address needs across our service territory. One of the areas of focus for VNG and its employees is addressing food insecurity in our community.

Each year, VNG volunteers dedicate their time to organizations such as the Foodbank of Southeastern Virginia and the Eastern Shore and the Virginia Peninsula Foodbank, sorting food donations, distributing them to families through mobile markets and helping to expand access to nutritious foods. In addition, employees and contractors participate in food drives to collect and deliver nonperishable food items to local food pantries like Proclaiming Grace Outreach in New Kent County. These efforts are complemented by generous grants, donations and sponsorships from the Virginia Natural Gas Foundation and the Virginia Natural Gas Charitable Giving Program, further empowering local organizations dedicated to fighting hunger.

The spirit of volunteerism is woven into our culture. As Bob Latvis, CEO of the Virginia Peninsula Foodbank, notes, "Virginia Natural Gas remains a generous and steadfast supporter of our mission to provide healthy food to families experiencing food insecurity. It's always inspiring to see the commitment of our partners like Virginia Natural Gas, who make our communities thrive so families can prosper and live healthier lives."

Through these collective efforts, Virginia Natural Gas volunteers show even small actions can make a profound impact, proving by giving their time, energy and resources, we can make a lasting difference in the fight against hunger.

# Environmental

## Employees Support Local Bat Conservation

Virginia is home to 17 species of bats, including two federally endangered species: the Virginia Big-eared Bat and the Northern Long-eared Bat. In Hampton Roads alone, at least 13 species have been observed, such as the Big Brown Bat, Eastern Red Bat and Tri-colored Bat. These fascinating creatures play a vital role in maintaining healthy ecosystems.

This year, volunteers from the Virginia Natural Gas EverGreen team gathered for a special lunch and learn focused on bat conservation. The event highlighted the ecological importance of bats and explored ways to support their declining populations.

Bats serve as nature's pest control, with a single bat capable of consuming hundreds of mosquitoes in just one hour. In the warm, humid climate of Hampton Roads, bats help control insect populations, benefiting both public comfort and agriculture while reducing the need for chemical pesticides.

To support local bat conservation efforts, EverGreen volunteers built several bat houses to be installed at VNG office locations and throughout the community. Each bat house can shelter up to 300 bats, providing a safe, dry space to rest and raise their young. Once installed, these small boxes can have a big impact, especially in areas like Hampton Roads, where natural roosting sites are disappearing.

EverGreen is an employee-led volunteer group at VNG dedicated to promoting sustainability and environmental stewardship. Through hands-on projects and community partnerships, EverGreen supports initiatives that protect local wildlife, promote biodiversity and engage employees in meaningful conservation work.

## The Southern Company Foundation Sustainability Professorship

The Historically Black Colleges and Universities Sustainable Communities Initiative (HBCU SCI) awarded a total of \$1,000,000 in matching grants to Hampton University and Virginia State University as part of the Southern Company Endowed Professorships in Sustainability program. Funded by the Southern Company Foundation, HBCU SCI is a collaborative initiative led by INROADS, UNCF, and the Thurgood Marshal College Fund. Its mission is to empower students at HBCUs in Southern Company's service areas with the awareness, skills and opportunities to become informed leaders in building more sustainable communities.

With this support, Hampton University plans to enhance its Center for Atmospheric Sciences, expanding research capacity and creating pathways for students and faculty to lead solutions driven work that supports resilient, sustainable communities.
